Sakura Science Plan (SSP) is the Japan-Asia Youth Exchange Program in Science, which is sponsored by the Japan Science and Technology Agency (JST) in a collaboration of industry-academia-government. Through the SSP, implemented in 2014, approximately 26,000 young people have been invited from Asian countries (now additionally eligible for countries in Latin America) to Japan to have experience or training in Japanese science and technology [https://ssp.jst.go.jp/EN/outline/index.html]. As for our graduate school, fifteen proposed plans were adopted in the past five fiscal years (FY2014 - FY2018), and students and young researchers from Thailand, Cambodia, Myanmar, China, Indonesia and the Philippines participated in the programs.* In FY2019, following three plans for experience/training programs have been carried out or is now scheduled: (1) Kasetsart University (Thailand) and Royal University of Agriculture (Cambodia), 10 students, during Jun 8-16, Photos 1 & 2; (2) Southwest Forestry University (China), 10 students, during Sep 8-14, Photos 3-5; (3) Jadavpur University (India), 10 students, scheduled during Jan 26-Feb 1, 2020. We hope that students who participate in the SSP programs are inspired and motivated to enter our graduate school in the near future. (*, Please refer to the table in the next page.)
